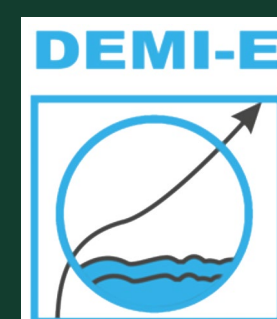


Niger Water Projects Highlights *2009-2023*


Target households now have access to safe drinking water - *compared to 29%* at the start of the project
